The earliest records of our branch of the family show that in 1748 some Bostocks were living at Heage, a chapelry of 2300 inhabitants and 2300 acres, situate in the parish of Duffield Hundred of Morleston, Derbyshire. Heage is $2^1/_2m$. from Belper on the Belper and Chesterfield road and 5m. SW of Alfreton. It is probable that while there the family followed the occupation of cordwainery, owned a cottage and small pasture in the village still known as "Bostock's Leasow", "Crofts" or "Closes", and paid acknowledgment to the Lord of the Manor of 1/- yearly.

The name was formerly written Bostock or Botestock; the arms are "Sable a feese humette argent"; the crest is on the stump of a tree erect argent a boar's head erased sable muzzledo or and the motto "Intente in Deum animo". (There is a coloured sketch of the arms in the possession of Edwin Bostock, Esq., of Tixall Lodge obtained from the Herald's College.) A family tradition resting only on slight authority says that Lord William de Bostck (sic) came over with William the Conqueror; he and his 7 or 9 sons fought round the Standard at the Battle of Hastings and they had their own flag with the motto "Corvi praesentes" - "The crows are about".

Ormerod's History of Cheshire (2 Vols. folio) states that there were Bostocks of Bostock, Tarporley, Churton, Mobberley &c all in Cheshire and other records tell of branches located in the Counties of Derby, Surrey, Northampton and Hertford. One of the most notable of these offshoots was John Lord Abbot of St Albans in the 15th century and known as John of Wheathampton. In order to ascertain the number of families bearing the unique name of Bostock and to find out whether the clan is still strongly represented in Cheshire it is suggested that reference be made to each of the County Directories and the names and addresses copied. Such a list would be both interesting and valuable and correspondence might be opened.

The manor of Bostock was possessed for several generations by the ancient family of Bostock (so states Burke's Visitation of seats and arms published 1852), who took their name from the township and claimed descent from Psmer (sic) who was the Saxon lord of Bostock and several other townships in the time of Edward the Confessor. The Pedigree deduce the line of the Bostocks from him (refer to Ormrod's History for full account coat of arms and documentary evidence) and state his fifth descendant Sir Warin de Bostock to have married Hawise Countess of Lincoln in her own right, widow of Roger de Quenci and daughter of Hugh Kevelise Earl.

The heiress of the elder branch of the Bostocks brought the estate in the latter part of the fifteenth century to the Savages, with whom it appears to have continued until the

termination of the direct male line in Richard Lord Rivers, about which time it was alienated. Subsequently Bostock was possessed by Tomkinsons of Manchester, but passed after the decease of William Tomkinson in 1770 by devise to his cousin Edward Tomkinson, Esq., who afterwards assumed the name Wettenhall. By him the mansion as it now stands was built, but after a short possession he sold it to Thomas France, Esq., who in 1803 pulled down the ancient Bostock Hall, a wooden building surrounded by a moat. From him it descended to his son the present (1822) owner James France France, Esq., who in 1893.....

Bostock Hall is situate 2m. NW of Middlewich. On Bostock Green is an old oak, which is curious as marking - according to general belief -the centre of the county.

How and when our progenitor reached Heage is not known, but it is probable that he came from Cheshire, was of the ancient house, and descended from one of the numerous branches. present, however, genealogical evidence proving this is not available. All baptisms, marriages and deaths of families at Heage were recorded at Duffield, whose church registers go back to 1598. These have been searched and the earliest entry is 1748, 17th December: Bapt. Amey daughter of THOMAS Bostock Heage. (See Shepard's Research Bostock Tree back to A.D.1500.) About 1740 and before 1748 three brothers, Thomas, Benjamin and Joseph, moved to Heage. All three died in the same year, 1776, and Benjamin and Joseph in the same month, May, and were buried one on the 17th and the other on the 25th. Hannah Bostock, whose burial is recorded 20th March 1785 was probably the wife of either Benjamin or Joseph and the mother of Hannah and Elizabeth (refer to list of entries at Duffield). Hannah married Benjamin Blount 22nd Degember 1773 (banns published December 6th, 13th and 20th, 1772 (sic) "both of this parish" and Elizabeth married Edward Duesbury 1st January 1787.

THOMAS - the progenitor of the family, was a cordwainer (?), lived at Heage, predeceased his brothers, and was buried 31st January 1776; no tombstone. He married 176.. SARAH ALLSOPP of ... and left issue Amey, William and John.

- (i) WALTER of Aigburth near Liverpool, Boot Seller in Paradise Street, and afterwards of 22 Cressington near Liverpool, Gent., died there 14th Oct. 1877; married ROSA BREWE of Liverpool (sister to LOUISA, wife of FREDERICK Bostock of Northampton and Stepdaughter of Mary Irene "Newey", who kept house for Thomas Bostock of Stone while a bachelor). She died 3rd Nov. 1882 at 27 St Paul's Road, Camden Town, Middlesex and there were no children.
- (ii) ELIZA, familiarly "Pop" born 18..; died 18..; married Thomas Wagstaff, "Toss", of Hatter; the two daughters died young. "Pop" had a hasty temper passionate and when roused her eyes quite flashed. They were very dark with a ring of grey round the iris and this showed quite a circle of light. She wore two curls by the eyes.

The sign was rather indistinct and the neighbours called it "The Split Crow". He remembered distinctly The Pretender's rising of 1715 and said the army came within a few miles of Heage. Left issue: Joseph, Samuel, George, Thomas and Katherine.

"Old Sammy" came to Rickerscote sometimes and Old Susan Bostock is remembered at Heage, bent and with white hair. The cottage they lived in is half way through the village - the middle one of three - and in 1892 was occupied by an old woman, Joyce Sparham. The ancestral cottage with the sign "The Spread Eagle" was pulled down and rebuilt by Squire Hurt. A garden is in front and Bostock's Croft (2) are on the sloping hillside across the road - good pasture.

Married THOMAS BRADLEY of Rickerscote, who died at Common Road, Stafford, 13th Jan. 1868 aged 85 years; stone inscribed "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord". He married twice and his second wife TISSIE was an old cat. When he was supposed to be dying she removed the pillow (believed he couldn't die easily otherwise), straightened his legs out, took off his stockings and really was glad he was dying. She was an old hypocrite and had a cracked voice.
- (iv) THOMAS, Son of William, son of Thomas of Rickerscote, Cordwainer, born 17th March 1777 at Heage, bapt. 25th March Connection of the Strutts who were the family in Belper and named it. Their family crest is a bear with a ragged staff and Thomas carved this on a chest, which he had bought with his own savings, and now in Northampton (47 Sheep Street); (this area I believe is part of Northampton Bus Station, S.J.L.); an oil painting of him is in the possession of Mrs. S.A. Byrd, his daughter. When a youth, he went to Manchester from Heage with only a few shillings to

seek for a living. At Heage he attended a night and day school. For some years he lived at Nottingham as foreman to Mr. Saunders, Boot Manufacturer, and became acquainted with the two young ladies, one of whom he afterwards married. In 1814 he came to Stafford and began a Boot and Shoe business in Broad Eye, moved to Lammascotes end of Eastgate Street by the City gateposts, then to near the "Old Unicorn", now the "Shrewsbury Arms" next to Allwood's house, where his wife died and while there he married again; and when Benjamin his son died, he went to Friar's Passage and afterwards to Rickerscote near Stafford where he died 3rd March 1865 aged 87, and was buried at Castle Church, Stafford (tombstone). He was good to his father and mother and helped to support them. He married first SARAH DUDLEY (maternal to Mary Dudley Saunders surnamed "Peter" of Loughborough and sisterοf his old master - he was a dutiful apprentice) at Old Redford Church, Nottingham in 1805. She was born 19th June 1782, died 25th Aug. 1824 at Allwood House, Greengate Street, Stafford aged 42 and was buried at St. Mary's, Stafford, Earl Street End near a walled garden; there is no tombstone.

His second wife was SARAH HALL, born 31st Jan. 1790; married 22nd Aug. 1827 in St. Peter's Church, Nottingham; died 2nd Feb. 1852 aged 62 and lies buried in Castle Church, Stafford.

By his first wife he had 9 sons (see Family Bible in possession of F.M. & F.D. Bostock of Cheltenham).

(1) WILLIAM of Runcorn and Wellingborough was in the shoe trade; born 28th Dec 1805 at 4.15 p.m. at ... Died Wellingborough 1800; married at Runcorn MARY BATES - "Aunt Mary of Billing Road, Northampton" left no issue. He was rather a stout little man, dark, and took snuff in handfuls - had a deep bass voice, a tremendous "corporation" and used to come rolling along. He was reported to be an amateur Bluebeard with many wives. A queer 'un was William. He stayed occasionally at Rickerscote with his father and would then bring a fine rooster with him, ostensibly to improve the breed, but the real object was cock-fighting. "Oh capital bird", he'd say, "will get you a fine set of chickens, old man." On Sunday morning he would refuse his father's request to go with him and his mother to Chapel, saying he would go and smoke a pipe with "Old Bradley" opposite, then he'd afterwards put down his gamecock and watching him fighting for hours together. All the birds in the yard set on his. "Ah, he was a bit of a bad 'un."

William Henry Dorman, father of the bride, was Pastor. She was born 17th Oct. 1808; died at The Hough 27th June 1885 aged 76, and was buried at the Cemetery; 10 children.
- (A) THOMAS of Langdale, Newport Road, Stafford; Boot & Shoe Manufacturer, born 13th Aug. 18..; married SOPHIA, daughter of William Henry Dorman of Chelmsford, Minister, and Selina his wife nee Robinson at Registrar's Office, Reading. G.V. Wigram, J.W. Darby and W.H. Dorman were there "such a nice meeting after".

His workmen struck on his introduction of two sewing machines into the Shoe Factory, but two girls worked them and stuck to him. They were escorted home for meals by 12 policemen, and Thomas carried a life-preserver. When he had built the factory, the men struck because compelled to work in there, instead of taking it home. The Wedding day was on a 2nd October, Fair Day at Stafford. Thomas B. of Rickerscote would ride on box seat of fly (Frederick B. of Northampton, wife and Mrs S.A. Byrd were inside) and kept waving his hand when passing through the market. He was greatly excited. At the Wedding Breakfast, he made a speech and expatiated on his coming to that factory and asking for work, but now it was owned by his There were 6 children: son.
